Remember, *Malaika Favorite: Retrospective of a Hardback Woman, 1970–2010* (works from 2009-2010) will be on view until March 30, 2011.

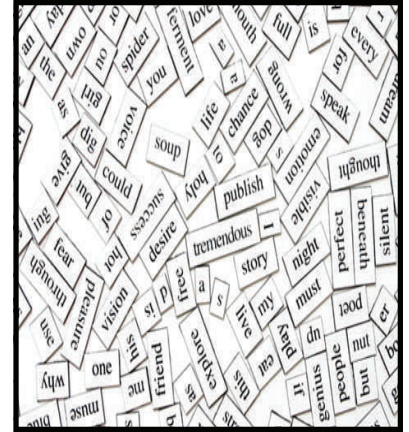
